

ARTICLE IV
Election and Designation of Officers

Section 1. Board of Directors (rev. April 2010)

The Board of Directors shall be designated at the ~~bi-annual~~ **biennial** meeting, and shall preside for a term of two years ~~or until such time as their successors are designated~~. The Board shall consist of the following persons: The President, the Vice-President, the Treasurer and the Secretary; the Past President for each of the previous four terms, four additional members, one to be named by each of the four past Presidents to serve for terms of two years.

Section 2. Election of Officers (rev. April 2010)

The President, Vice-President, Treasurer and Secretary shall be elected by a plurality vote of the members present and voting at the annual meeting and shall serve for a term of two years, ~~or until such time as their successors are elected~~. **The President, Vice-President, and the Secretary shall serve at maximum 2 elected consecutive terms in their respective position.** The Vice President shall accept the position with the understanding that they may succeed the President. This assures the membership that the office of President will be filled with someone educated with the workings of the Board of Directors.

Section 3. Election Committee

An election committee, consisting of the immediate past President, the Secretary, and one member-at-large, shall coordinate and orchestrate the process of nominations, voting, and tabulation of results for the biennial elections.

Section ~~3~~**4**. Election of Committee Chair~~man~~person

The Committee may elect a Chairperson for said Committee if one is not appointed by the Board of Directors. Said position shall serve a term of two years.

Section 5. Election of SEMBOA Representative to the Massachusetts Federation of Building Officials, Inc. (MFBO) Board of Directors

According to the bylaws of MFBO, SEMBOA shall be represented by the required number of positions and the President of SEMBOA to the Federation Board of Directors. The term of a Board member shall not exceed two (2) years without re-election.
